

Cabrillo College Foundation
Policy on Political Activities

Approved by Executive Committee April 9, 2008

As a tax-exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, the Cabrillo College Foundation cannot intervene in any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office. Violation of this prohibition could cause the Cabrillo College Foundation to lose its tax-exempt status or incur excise taxes imposed on political expenditures. To ensure that the Cabrillo College Foundation does not jeopardize its tax-exempt status or incur excise taxes on political expenditures, the Cabrillo College Foundation, including any individual acting on behalf of the Cabrillo College Foundation, will not engage in any of the following on Cabrillo College Foundation property, during any Cabrillo College Foundation function, or otherwise using Cabrillo College Foundation resources or facilities:

- Endorsing any candidate for public office
- Donating or contributing to any candidate's campaign
- Participating or engaging in political fundraising events
- Publishing or distributing statements for or against any candidate
- Engaging in any other activity that favors or opposes any candidate
