Introduces core principles used to understand the ways in which social structures, institutions, and processes affect human experiences, perceptions, and behaviors. Topics include culture, families, education, health, economy, and politics. Emphasizes race, class, and gender as integral dimensions of social life and inequality.

Topics include systemic inequalities along socioeconomic, racial/ethnic, and gender lines and problems in major areas of social life including families, schools, health, and law. SOC 2H Honors Contemp Social Problems

Examines the social, economic, and political causes and consequences of major social problems. Analyzes the ways in which social problems are constructed, defined, and addressed. Topics include income and wealth disparities, structural poverty, institutional racism, gender discrimination, families, health care, education, and the criminal justice system. Highlights student research, writing, and reporting, both individually and as part of a learning community, and will often meet in a seminar format. Prerequisite: Honors standing. Recommended Preparation: ENGL 1A/ENGL 1AH/ ENGL 1AMC/ENGL 1AMCH. Grading: Letter Grade Only.

Examines the contemporary experiences of Latino/a groups in the U.S., focusing on regional, national, and transnational processes. Surveys the conditions of a wide range of U.S. Latinos/as, including groups from Mexican, Latin American, and Caribbean backgrounds. Topics may include immigration, segregation, racism, education, language and culture, socioeconomic and labor force status, political participation, and civil rights. This course meets the Cabrillo College multicultural studies requirement.

Topics may include colonialism, globalization, poverty, health, technological and environmental change, and social movements. This course meets the Cabrillo College multicultural studies requirement.
