- (8) This is the **location** of the class. If a class is held at a location other than the Aptos Campus or Watsonville Center, further description will be given.
- (9) If the class does not meet for the entire semester, this line gives the **beginning and ending dates** as well as relevant information for the class.

Students of all levels, from beginning to advanced Spanish, are invited to join Cabrillo College instructor, Felix Robles, for four weeks of study in an intensive language/culture program in the colonial South American city of Cusco, Peru.

Program cost includes: round-trip international and national airfare; ground transportation to and from airports in Peru; room and board in the home of a Peruvian family; language instruction and cultural courses in small classes; individual conversation program with a Peruvian; three days in Lima, two days in Machu Picchu, and two days in Lake Titicaca; excursions to archeological sites near Cusco; excursions to museums and galleries in Cusco (admission fees not included); and health and trip insurance. The program cost stated does not include tuition and fees for Cabrillo College classes.

Participants must be 18 years or older or be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Participants must register for a Cabrillo College Spanish class in Wintersession 2012.
